



AUSTRALIAN FIRE & FIRST AID

CHIEF WARDEN TRAINING

DESCRIPTION

This course applies to a range of settings where emergencies requiring evacuation may occur. It is particularly relevant for organisations that require particular staff to be trained as Chief Wardens with skills in emergency management and basic fire fighting, to manage or contain small fire emergencies in the workplace.

PRE-REQUISITES

Students must be 18 years of age or older and hold an appropriate level of education to undergo assessment.

DURATION

6 hours classroom training and assessment plus a workplace simulation.

ASSESSMENT METHOD

Progressive assessment throughout the course, including demonstration of practical skills and written and oral questions relating to underpinning knowledge.

COURSE CONTENT

- + Alarms and warning systems
- + Emergency evacuation procedures for your workplace
- + Initiating an appropriate emergency response
- + Fire Warden responsibilities
- + Location of emergency resources in the work area
- + Checking serviceability of fire response equipment
- + Characteristics of fire and fuel types
- + Types of fire extinguishers
- + Use of extinguishers to contain fire in the workplace
